


The ColRich Mission Building Lasting Communities

Thrive Program Elements

At the heart of our **Thrive** program are some incredible people, devoting their time and resources in support of our mission. Our **Resident Advocates** and **Resident Ambassadors** work hard to build community in a variety of ways. Day in and day out, they are making themselves seen and felt at our multifamily properties. In addition, we have important **Thrive physical assets** located on our properties, which are special spaces filled with children and families. On any given day at a ColRich property, you'll find either a **Resident Advocate** or **Ambassador** at work in service of others.




Thrive Resident Advocates

First and foremost are our Resident Advocates, uniquely qualified social service professionals who interact with and serve residents and employees at our property. We currently have 11 Resident Advocates at 22 properties. Already connected in their local communities and with prior social services expertise, Resident Advocates help our residents apply for rent and utility assistance, unemployment benefits, and food stability programs. They are skilled at connecting those in need with physical and mental health services, crisis counseling and wellness coaching. They even assist with resume writing and stay updated on upcoming job fairs. For our young residents, Resident Advocates are knowledgeable about local afterschool programming, youth development groups and opportunities for free lunch and school supplies for students of working-class families.





Thrive Resident Ambassadors



Our Resident Ambassadors bring a special energy and authenticity to our Thrive program because they live onsite and interact directly with their own neighbors. They have full-time jobs offsite but because they are residents themselves, they are personally invested. In lieu of rent, our Resident Ambassadors spend designated hours planning community-building activities and events, welcoming and connecting neighbors, and assisting

fellow residents with special needs. Ambassadors, who make a two-year commitment to our Thrive program, have a measurable positive impact on on our properties' overall lease renewal success.





Thrive Community Spaces

Much of the magic of our Thrive program happens in our onsite Community Rooms and Kids Clubs which are utilized for important purposes such as resident support, job fairs and special events.





At some properties, ColRich has built dedicated Kids Clubs to provide tutoring, after-school activities with homework tables, craft areas, mini-libraries, board games, and WiFi.

Thrive Community Spaces New Kids Club at Novi (CO)

Our young residents are enjoying and energizing this brand new space at Novi with arts and crafts, old-fashioned board games, homework and big smiles. Their parents tell us they feel so relieved to have a safe space for their kids to go. And the children now run all the way home as soon as they are out of class so they can get to the new activity room. One second-grader said to our Resident Advocate Michelle, "Can you even imagine what our lives would be like if we didn't live here? This is the best place ever!"









Helping One Another Thrive

We helped Suzanne P. complete a rental assistance application to receive thousands of dollars in rent relief, so she could stay in her home, maintain custody of her 12-year-old daughter and support her disabled son with mental health issues. Suzanne now has hope for a brighter future.

At Elm, Resident Advocate Michelle created an incredible partnership with the Lunchbox Express program at the local Jewish Family Services. As a result of her proactive outreach on behalf of her residents, the Lunchbox Express team provided free lunches for all the children living at Elm Monday through Friday throughout the entire summer.





Pregnant with her fourth child, single mom Lori had recently emigrated to the U.S. and met with Resident Advocate Becky after settling in at her new community.
